

Oriana House Addiction Treatment

Oriana House offers substance abuse treatment services for individuals at all stages of their recovery. The substance abuse treatment programs provided by Oriana House are certified by the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Addiction Services.



Assessments - Before any alcohol or substance abuse treatment program can begin, an assessment is needed in order to determine an appropriate treatment plan and goals. A substance abuse assessment by a licensed treatment counselor helps the client and the counselor determine the severity of the problem. Individuals in need of an assessment can call **330-996-7730** to schedule an appointment or ask about walk-in hours. Assessments can last up to three hours.

Inpatient and Outpatient Detoxification - The Detoxification Unit at the Summit County Alcohol, Drug Addiction, and Mental Health (ADM) Services Crisis Center provides medically supervised, inpatient (sub-acute) and outpatient (ambulatory) services to adult, Summit County residents who are intoxicated or experiencing withdrawal symptoms. The detoxification process consists of three essential components: evaluation, stabilization, and preparation for entry into substance abuse treatment. Nursing care and medical support from a physician, and assessment and referral services with a licensed treatment counselor are provided.

Rigel Recovery Services - Outpatient Treatment for Opiate Addiction



Vivitrol Treatment Program - Rigel Recovery Services and Summit Psychological Associates, Inc. have partnered to provide outpatient medication assisted treatment and mental health counseling. The prescription medication Vivitrol™ is often the best choice for an individual who is addicted to opioids (includes heroin and many prescription drugs). Vivitrol is an extended release, injectable medicine, that blocks the effects of opioids for approximately 30 days.

The benefits of including Vivitrol as part of a comprehensive substance abuse treatment plan include: significantly more days of sobriety, staying in treatment longer, eliminating or reducing cravings, and less likelihood of relapse.

Taking medication for opioid addiction is like taking medication to control any chronic illness. It is not the same as substituting one addictive drug for another. And Vivitrol is non-addictive; stopping its use does not cause withdrawal.

Intensive Outpatient Treatment - Outpatient treatment specific to the use of opioids, without the use of medication, is also available at Rigel Recovery Services. Licensed treatment counselors introduce participants to resources including detoxification, twelve step groups, family sessions, and peer support services. The goal is to provide a level of care specific to opioid use that assists with and increases the ability to cope with cravings, reduces relapses, and facilitates lifestyle changes that support abstinence.

Recovery Coaches - Recovery coaches provide support through all aspects of treatment and recovery. Recovery coaches have gone through their own recovery and are trained to serve as personal guides and mentors to others who are seeking or in recovery.

Treatment Readiness - These groups engage individuals in the recovery process while they await services for their next level of care. There are two group facilitators, a licensed treatment counselor and a recovery coach, who help participants identify their individual barriers and develop and practice relapse prevention skills.

Support Groups - Peer support groups, led by recovery coaches, provide information and encouragement to keep individuals motivated and on-track in their recovery.

Aftercare - Once treatment is completed, Aftercare provides continued support through group sessions for people in recovery so they can maintain sobriety.

Family Matters - Family support is one of the most important components in a person's recovery process. Therefore we offer the Family Matters program designed to support family members and loved ones and teach skills for healthy relationships.

Through weekly meetings participants gain effective communication skills; develop the ability to appropriately express their feelings; and acquire problem solving and effective decision making skills. By teaching all members of the family about the disease of chemical dependency, successful recoveries increase and relapses decrease.
